

2013 Grants Clearinghouse Award Summary



**GRANT AWARDS ANNOUNCEMENT:
2013 CALIFORNIA FIRE SAFE COUNCIL GRANTS CLEARINGHOUSE**

The California Fire Safe Council (CFSC) is pleased to report on its 2013 Grants Clearinghouse Awards. 51 grants totaling \$4,422,086 have been selected. The organizations selected to receive the awards are matching them with \$5,752,214 in non-federal funds.

CFSC received 139 applications requesting \$12,380,503. The decisions that have been made are preliminary funding decisions at this time based on funding and the next steps in the Clearinghouse.

The projects are being funded by a grant from the Cooperative Fire Program of the U.S. Forest Service, Department of Agriculture, Pacific Southwest Region, through the California Fire Safe Council. The Grant Awards are divided into two groups, the State Fire Assistance "X" (SFAX) projects (10) and the State Fire Assistance (SFA) projects (41)
